
Famous Artwork in Winter

You will need:

- Examples of famous paintings, like:
 - Mona Lisa (Leonardo da Vinci)
 - The Scream (Munch)
 - Starry Night (Van Gogh)
 - The Persistence of Memory (Dali)
 - Whistler's Mother (Whistler)
 - any artists that you have been studying
- paints or other media









Instructions

- 1. Look at the famous painting and think how the same scene would look in winter. Would there be snow, frost, or icicles? If the picture includes a person, what winter clothes would they be wearing? Be as imaginative as possible.
- 2. Make some notes and sketches of what you might want to include.
- 3. Look at some real winter scenes and take note of the color palette.
- 4. Paint (or pastel) a practice sheet with a winter color palette.
- 5. Plan out your picture using pencil.
- 6. Paint or pastel your winter version of the picture.

Alternative/Additional Activities

- Add sparkles or shimmer to make ice shine.
- · Add in other people in the distance.
- Carry out this same task but using sculpture with artists such as Giacometti.
- Work as a class to make the Terracotta Army in winter, each doing one person.
- Do one painting over four seasons and make it a project for the entire school year
