

Present Tenses

Simple Present

Simple Present is also known as Present Simple and describes events which happen often.

e.g.

I bake

We bake

You bake (singular)

You bake (plural)

He/She/It bakes

They bake

Present Continuous

Present Continuous is also known as Present Progressive and describes events which are happening right now in the present moment.

e.g.

I am baking

We are baking

You are baking (singular)

You are baking (plural)

He/She/It is baking

They are baking

Present Perfect

Present Perfect describes events which started in the past and continued up until now.

e.g.

I have baked

We have baked

You have baked (singular)

You have baked (plural)

He/She/It has baked

They have baked

Present Perfect Continuous

Present Perfect Continuous, also known as Present Perfect Progressive, describes events which started at some point in the past that may not be finished.

e.g.

I have been baking

We have been baking

You have been baking (singular)

You have been baking (plural)

He/She/It has been baking

They have been baking
