

Irregular Past Tense Verbs



To talk about something that happened in the past, you can often add -ed to the end of the word.

Today I will **cook** dinner.

Yesterday I **cooked** dinner.

Other times, the action word in a sentence does not follow the -ed pattern.

eat-ate

build-built

keep-kept

sink-sank

win-won

shake-shook

know-knew

make-made

sleep-slept

throw-threw

come-came

cut-cut

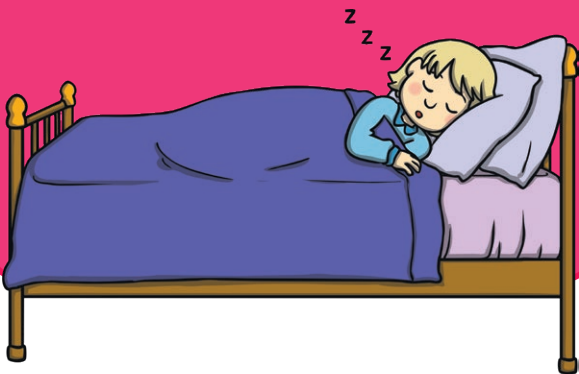
run-ran

I **sleep** in my bed.

I **slept** in my bed last night.



I **eat** breakfast every day.

I **ate** breakfast this morning.



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
