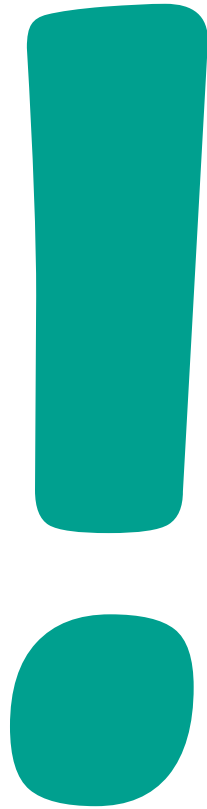


Exclamation Mark



**To show someone is exclaiming
or shouting something.**

**For example:
I am so excited!**



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Question Mark



**To show someone that someone
is asking a question.**

For example:

Do you have a pet dragon?



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Apostrophe



Allows us to join two words together.

For example:

do not becomes don't



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Apostrophe



To show possession.

For example:

**The children's toys
were tidied away.**



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Speech Marks



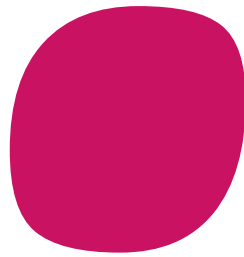
**To show us when
someone is talking.**

**For example:
“Hello”, said Susan.**



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Full Stop



**To show us when a
sentence is finished.**

For example:

I'm so sad this is over.



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Comma



**To show a little
pause in a sentence.**

For example:

**In the morning,
I ate my breakfast.**



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
