



Grammar: Future Tense

When we describe something that will happen in the future, we use the **future tense**. To form the future tense, we use a form of 'will' with the present form of the active verb in the sentence.
e.g.

Past: I went to the shops.

Present: I go to the shops.

Future: I will go to the shops.
