




Teacher instructions

- 1. The questions in this resource are editable, so think about what questions are appropriate for your students. Other options include:
 - · How many children will you have?
 - Who will you marry?
 - · What will you study at university?
 - · Where will you go on holiday?
- 2. Ask students to write down four options for each question. They can be silly and creative, and they can ask a friend to think of one bad option for them. Options for where will you live, for example, could include 'London, Miami, New York and The South Pole'.
- 3. Once students have completed their options, they close their eyes and draw a spiral in the box. They stop drawing when their partner shouts 'stop'. The students must then count the number of gaps between the lines.



4. Starting with the word MASH, students must then cross out every nth option (6th if there were 6 gaps, 7th if there were 7 gaps, 8th if there were 8 gaps) until only one word in each category remains. This is their future!



5. Students can then write out their possible futures in full sentences.

I will live in a mansion in Iceland with my pet dog, I will drive a limo to my job as a doctor.

I won't live in a hotel in Germany. I won't have a pet alligator. I won't drive a Ford Fiesta. I won't be an English tutor.
