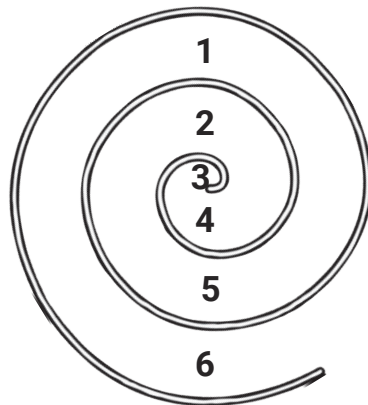

Teacher instructions

- The questions in this resource are editable, so think about what questions are appropriate for your students. Other options include:
 - How many children will you have?
 - Who will you marry?
 - What will you study at university?
 - Where will you go on holiday?
- Ask students to write down four options for each question. They can be silly and creative, and they can ask a friend to think of one bad option for them. Options for where will you live, for example, could include 'London, Miami, New York and The South Pole'.
- Once students have completed their options, they close their eyes and draw a spiral in the box. They stop drawing when their partner shouts 'stop'. The students must then count the number of gaps between the lines.



- Starting with the word MASH, students must then cross out every nth option (6th if there were 6 gaps, 7th if there were 7 gaps, 8th if there were 8 gaps) until only one word in each category remains. This is their future!
