

# Icebreaker Game: Me Too!

The idea of this game is to help students to understand that they have things in common with others in their class.

## What you need:

- A ball of wool
- Group of students

## How to play:

- Use a large space to create a circle with students.
- The teacher should model the game by saying a few sentences about themselves.
- If someone else can say the same thing about themselves, they say 'Me too!'
- Pass the ball of wool to that student but keep hold of a strand of wool. That student then continues to speak about themselves and play continues until all students have spoken.

For example:

"My name is Abdulla. My family are originally from Egypt but now live in the UAE. I am the youngest in my family."

Aisha is also the youngest in her family, so she says 'Me too!' Abdulla throws the ball of wool to her but keeps hold of a strand of wool. At the end of the game, you will have made a web of wool. This can symbolise that we are all connected as a class group.
