## 'Going to' for Future Plans/Intentions Speaking Game – Teacher Notes

Level: Elementary Level

Time: 45 min

Activity: 'Going to' for Future Plans/Intentions Speaking Game.

Preparation (5–10 min)	<ul> <li>Print one set of Grammar Cards, Game Boards and Flashcards for each group.</li> </ul>
	• Each group will also need a dice.
Procedure	Time
Use the Grammar Reference Sheet to review the form of 'going to' (subject+ be + going to + the base form of the verb). Students can keep this to refer to during the activity.	15 min
Review how 'going to' is used for future plans or intentions using concept check questions to help understanding and model some examples. Drill the pronunciation of the target language with the class paying attention to the weak form of 'to': going to /gəʊwiŋtə/.	
Explain the game instructions to students and model one example together as a class.	
Game Instructions: Students take it in turns to form sentences with 'going to'. First, they roll a dice for a time phrase, e.g. At the weekend. Next, they roll a dice for a subject pronoun, e.g. he. Then, they need to pick up a picture flashcard and form a correct sentence using 'going to'. For example, 'At the weekend, he is going to bake a cake. If needed, they can refer to the Grammar Reference Sheet to help them with the form of the auxiliary verb 'be'.	





Monitor the groups and make notes of any common errors.	10 min
Collect class feedback and spend some time on error correction.	
Extension Activity Ideas	Students write up some sentences from the activity.
	Students form sentences about their own future plans using the time cards as prompts.
