Henry VIII (Henry the 8th) was married six times. He divorced two of his wives and had two of them beheaded. One of his wives died because she was ill and Henry died while he was married to his sixth wife. He was king from 1509 - 1547.

Elizabeth I was the daughter of Henry VIII. Her mother was Anne Boleyn, who Henry VIII had killed. Elizabeth was queen when England fought a war with Spain. Elizabeth never married or had children. She was queen from 1558 - 1603.
