

How can I use this with my children?

Play as a team or work out the answers together as a themed activity in the style of a quiz.

How does this help my children's learning?

Solving riddles can help children develop logical thinking through processing the question to work out the answer.

Ideas for further learning:

Why not research and write a set of questions of your own to use as part of a quiz or riddle activity too?



Under the Sea Riddles

You will need:

prepared riddle cards

a space to play

counters to use to show the points score as the game is played

Preparation:

- 1. Print out a set of the riddle questions.
- 2. Print out a set of answers.
- 3. Glue the two pages back to back so the answers line up with the questions.
- 4. Cut out the cards.
- 5. Alternatively, one quiz master uses the question cards with the answers to read to the players.

Instructions:

- 1. Players take it in turns to read a riddle to the other player or team.
- 2. The player has to try and guess or work out the answer.
- 3. If the answer is correct, the team or player earn a point counter.
- 4. At the end of the questions, count how many counter points each team has.
- 5. The player or team with the most points wins.

Alternatively, quiz each other and work out the answers together.






