

Types of Sentences

Declarative

Statements express ideas and opinions. They end with a period.

Imperative

Commands give instructions. They usually end with a period, but sometimes they end with an exclamation mark.

Interrogative

Questions ask for information. They end with a question mark.

Exclamatory

Exclamations indicate strong emotions. They end with an exclamation mark.
