

Mammals

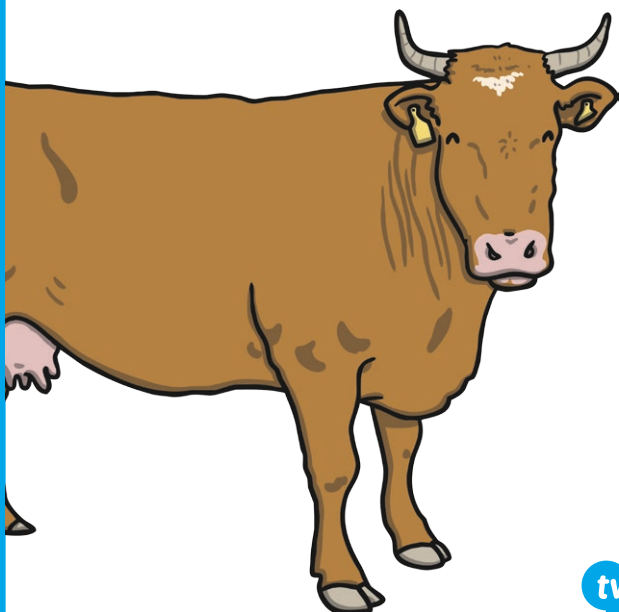
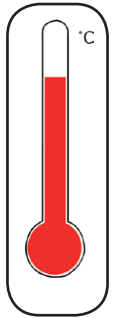
Are warm-blooded.

Amphibians

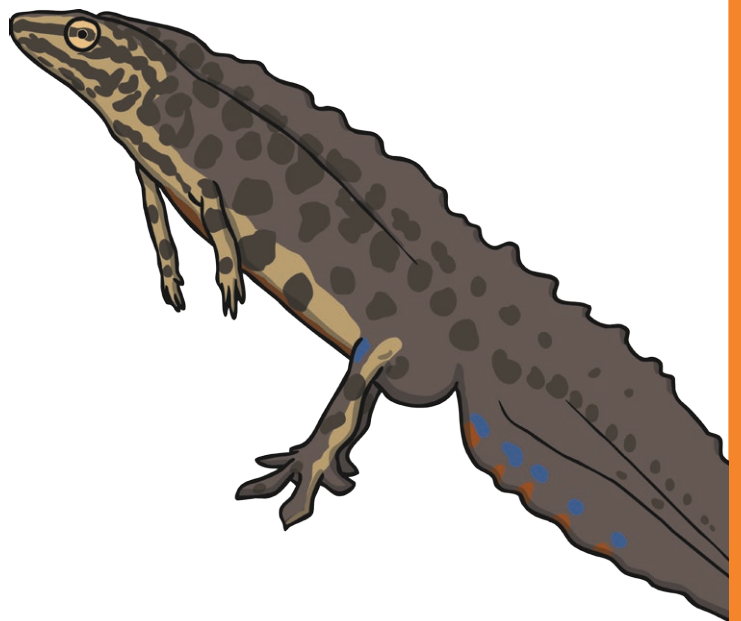
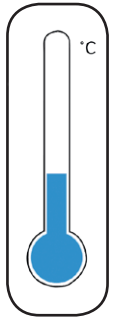
Are cold-blooded.

Reptiles

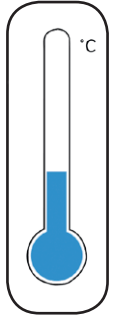
Are cold-blooded.

Fish

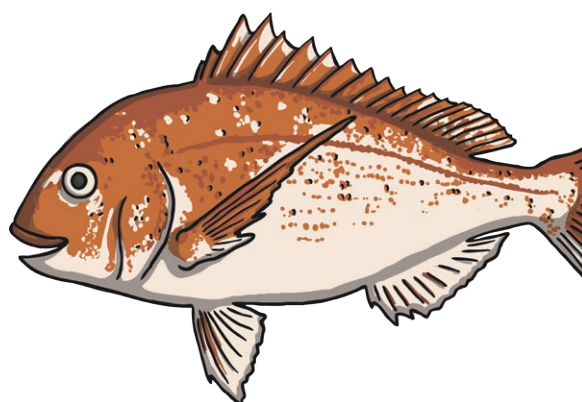
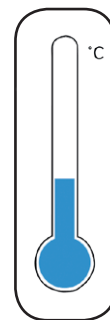
Are cold-blooded.

Birds

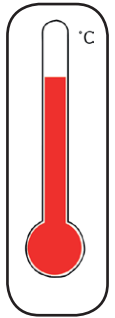
Are warm-blooded.

Have wings.

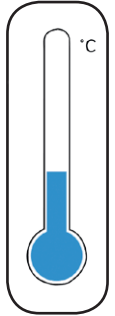
Have feathers.
