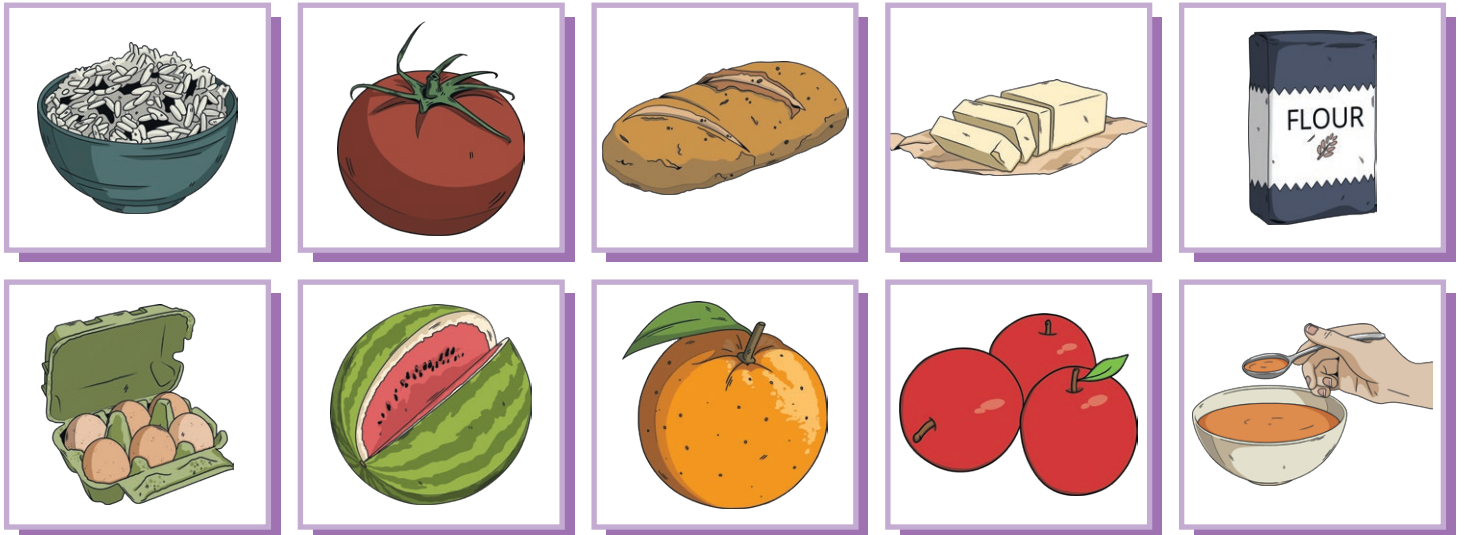


Countable and Uncountable Nouns
